## CSC ANNUAL FALL SHOPPING TRIP

It is that time of year again; time to mark your calendar to attend the annual shopping trip sponsored by the Civil Service Council. On Saturday, December 7, 2013, join us on the bus trip to Woodfield Mall. Woodfield has the finest collection of department stores and specialty shops in the Great Lakes region including Nordstrom, Macy's, Lord & Taylor, JC Penney, Sears, and nearly 300 other stores and restaurants. The Village of Schaumburg offers a free trolley

service during mall hours. The trolley makes stops in the area to popular places like IKEA, Dick's Sporting Goods, and Woodfield Village Green (with shops like Marshalls, Home Goods, and The Container Store).

Transportation is being provided via charter bus leaving University Street at the Bone Student Center at 7:30 a.m. The group will travel non-stop to the mall with an anticipated arrival to be just before 10 a.m. when the mall opens. IKEA will be an additional drop-off location. A courtesy baggage pick up will allow attendees to stow packages under the bus at 2 p.m. Evening departure to return to Bloomington/Normal is set for 5 p.m. from the mall.

This trip is a great time to shop without the hassle of driving to the Chicago area and parking. The trip is open to all civil service employees, administrative/professional employees, faculty, staff, and students. Attendees are encouraged to bring their friends and have a great day. People are encouraged to bring your own snacks and non-alcoholic drinks. No glass containers are allowed on the bus and all items must fit under vour bus seat.

Reserve your seats today by sending a check made payable to the "ISU CSC." The cost is \$25 for ISU employees/students (AP, CS, faculty, and retirees); \$30 for community members; and \$15 for children (12 years of age and younger). Please note that your Illinois State ID may be required when boarding the bus for those signed up at the ISU rate. Deadline to sign up is Monday, Nov. 25 at 4 p.m.

# ANNUAL GIVING TOPS 10,000 ALUMNI DONOR GOAL

The University Advancement staff closed out the 2013 fiscal year by hitting an exciting and important Annual Giving

milestone—10,000 alumni donors.

The Annual Fund finished the year with support from 10,151 alumni donors. Overall, the total number of donors to



the Annual Fund increased by 4.9 percent in FY13, which ended June 30.

Other giving highlights:

- Faculty and staff giving reached a 35 percent participation rate—up 5 percent over last year.
- The rebranded Senior Giving campaign, aimed at graduating students, reached an all-time high of 10 percent participation.
- Total fundraising activity for FY13 was nearly \$15 million in new cash and commitments. The exact total of \$14,758,061 was the third-largest fundraising year ever for Illinois State.

The Annual Giving staff, along with the entire University Advancement team, would like to thank all faculty and staff members for their help reaching these milestones. Every gift matters!
