It is that time of year again; time to mark your calendar to attend the annual shopping trip sponsored by the Civil Service Council. Saturday, Dec. 7, 2013 is the date chosen for the bus trip to Woodfield Mall. Reserve your seats today by sending a check made payable to the "ISU CSC." The cost is \$25 for ISU employees/students (AP, CS, faculty and retirees); \$30 for community members and \$15 for children (ages 12 years and younger). Please note an Illinois State ID may be required when boarding the bus for those signed up at the ISU rate. Deadline to sign up is Monday, Nov. 25 at 4 p.m.


