


GAMMA PHI CIRCUS SPRING SHOWS

Illinois State University's Gamma Phi Circus will host its 2014 Spring Shows in Redbird Arena with performances at 7 p.m. Friday, April 11, and at 1 p.m. and 7 p.m. Saturday, April 12.

All tickets are reserved seating, with prices starting at \$12 for adults, \$10 for students, senior citizens and military, \$8 for children ages 5 through 12, and \$2 for children under 5. This year lower bowl seating will be an additional dollar.

Tickets are available at the Braden Box Office, all Ticketmaster outlets, on Ticketmaster.com, by phone at (800) 745-3000, or at the door of Redbird Arena on show days. For ticket sales the days of performances, Redbird Arena Box Office will be open at 4 p.m. Friday, April 11 and from 10:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday, April 12. More information is available at





Before Saturday's 1 p.m. show, there will be a pre-show children's carnival that begins at noon with games and activities for all ages. Admission to the carnival is the matinee ticket. The pre-matinee carnival is sponsored by the Student Alumni Council.

The show is a two-hour performance featuring more than 15 unique acts. Gamma Phi performers will showcase many aerial, acrobatic and gymnastics acts commonly associated with professional circuses. Among these acts are Russian Swing, Wall Trampoline, multi-trapeze, tight wire, unicycles, Teeter Board, German Wheel, clowns and much more. This year's show will have a Chicago theme influenced by Chicago the musical, O'Hare Airport and the Chicago Bulls.

Gamma Phi Circus is the oldest collegiate circus in the United States and is celebrating its 85th birthday this year. Established in 1929, Gamma Phi is a leadership-based organization, dedicated to helping members grow as individuals as well as within the circus family.
