# Civil Service Council (CSC) Meeting <br> November 6, 2001

Christa Lawhun opened the meeting at 12:00 p.m.
Joe Rives and Dick Runner were here to present the PowerPoint final presentation of the Campus Master Plan:
Joe began by stating that the campus community should feel free to give their comments throughout the month of November.
The Master Plan - First Choice Public University - Small College feeling at a Large University.
Three main themes: Reinforce the benefits, support large comprehensive university, and embrace partnerships.
Plan proposes demolishing McCormick Hall and Walker Dunn Barton and reassigning Metcalf; completing three on-going building projects; changing Hancock into a u-shape for a different parking and amenities configuration; restructuring the Main and College intersection; improved housing; ecological park, and reserving the University farm Gregory Street property for future expansion.

Make no small plans - move forward - be bold.
Q. How long is plan? A. 15-20-25 years. Object is to paint picture of what University will look like. Decisions are to be made. A lot of things will be accomplished when doing other work.
Q. What about NCHS and U-High? A. Plan will be updated in 5 years - build off previous plan. For example 1990 plan had parking decks and pedestrian campus. A number of buildings were not built well, for example McCormick Hall. Plan looks at replacing with better buildings. Particular character, historic significance will be maintained. We won't gut campus. Great amount of maintenance will be balanced with other factors. Spending $\$ 18.7$ million for Schroeder, which is a good solid building. This is first Master Plan with an architectural style attached - new construction in style of old. NCHS is not on map by choice of NCHS Board. Held discussions with them earlier in our plan. Roundabouts if designed properly with amount of traffic and speed of traffic taken into account can work well. The College and Main intersection is now beyond capacity.
Q. Grasp of what is immediately after Schroeder? Parking is located where on peripheral? A. Proposed parking more than accommodates losses. Kingsley to Main will have 2500 cars on 2 levels and the North area will have 1200-1500 spaces on 2 levels. Won't remove parking before new is built; built temporary parking during College of Business construction. Deliberate effort to get out in front of parking needs - each year added 200-300 parking space needs. The Campus Master Plan proposes large parking areas that don't dominate landscape.
Q. Implement when? A. After Board of Trustees approval they will assign responsibility of implementation to Capital Planning and Building Committee.
Q. Redo Bone Student Center complex - what about deliveries by tractor trailer? A. At this level of planning want new face to parking lot. Have not gotten to design level yet.
