Council Chair Melody called the meeting to order at 12:01 pm.

Presentation: Gladly We Give Ambassador Mboka Mwilambwe Gladly We Give is a new Annual Fund for faculty, staff and retirees. The initiative asks, "What's your passion?" The program is Illinois State University's first comprehensive annual fund drive. The goal is participation, not the size of the gift. When development-staff contact corporate and other major sponsors, the level of participation among the university community is an indication of support and dedication. The participation rate is currently about 22% of faculty, staff and retirees giving financially to the university. The goal is to raise participation within three years to 50% who give a minimum \$10 gift.

Gladly We Give is also about saying Thank You to participants, and celebrating accomplishments made possible by donors.

Ongoing Discussion Topics:

- o Committee Reports
 - Brian emailed a draft of recommendations concerning computer access to all members. Council members should send any additional suggestions to Brian. The recommendations will be an action item at the next meeting.
 - The date for the Cubs game trip is expected to be Weds., May 27, for an early afternoon game against Pittsburg.
 - Elections committee is working on nomination forms, and expects to mail these in early March. There will be one vacancy in Group I, one in Group II, one in Group III, two in Group IV, one in Group V, and one Ex-Officio (Campus Communications Committee Representative).
- EAC Representative The Merit Board will meet February 18 in Urbana.
- Annuitants Representative Governor Quinn's budget proposal is expected to go to the legislature in mid-March. There is speculation in some areas that state income tax refunds might be delayed.

Related to state budget concerns, Valerie shared that she checked into a personal insurance payment delay and was told that the claims had been processed but payment would be delayed until funds became available. The state is required to pay interest on bills not paid within 30 days.

- Academic Senate/Campus Info/Foundation – Spring enrollment is very strong, up almost 300 students over last year. Applications for Fall, 2009 are already above last year's record numbers. The quality of applicants for the Presidential Scholarship Program was noted at the February 4 Academic Senate—350 applications for 30 seats evaluated on several factors resulted in rejecting one student with a 33 ACT and 4.0 GPA from the Honors Program.

Melody shared a memo from Provost Sherri Noren Everts inviting Council members to attend the Academic Affairs Annual Planning Presentations. These will be Tuesday, March 24 and Wednesday, march 25, 8:30 a.m. until 12 noon in the Bone Student Center Old main Room. Proposals by the deans/major administrators will be available at the Milner Library reference desk a week before the presentations. Jac asked if these presentations qualified for release time. Nancy will check.
