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

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CIVIL SERVICE COUNCIL NOMINATIONS

Nominations for candidates to fill upcoming vacancies on the Civil Service Council will be accepted only through May 15. This is a terrific opportunity to serve your campus group and the campus civil service members.

The Council's goals are:





- To assist the administration and the Office of Human Resources in their efforts to provide clear communication within the University community.
- To encourage fellow employees to assist the Board of Trustees and administration in making Illinois State University an even greater institution of higher education.
- To place a greater emphasis on Council fund raising in order to award a greater number of Civil Service scholarships.

In addition to the goals listed above, while serving on the Council you will have the opportunity to meet other Illinois State University employees (Civil Service, AP and Faculty), learn more about the university, and have some fun. It is a great opportunity, and all eligible civil service employees are strongly encouraged to become a candidate.

You should have received a nomination form in campus mail this month, but if not or if you have misplaced it, contact information is listed in the last paragraph. Once nominations are closed, ballots will be prepared and distributed via campus mail. It will be equally important for you to **cast your vote**. New council members will be seated in July. Council members serve a term of three years and are permitted to serve consecutive terms, but must be re-elected for each three-year term.

Each group has three seats on the Council, and one of the seats becomes vacant every year. Due to retirements or resignations for other reasons, some groups will have multiple vacancies to fill during this election.



Vacancies in each group are as follows:

- ✓ Group I One full 3-year term
- ✓ Group II One full 3-year term
- ✓ Group III One full 3-year term and one 2-year term
- ✓ Group IV -One full-3year term and one 2-year term
- ✓ Group V One full 3-year term and one 1-year term

It is no longer a requirement to have supervisor pre-approval to become a candidate; however you will need to regularly be available the first and third Tuesdays of each month. Meetings are held at noon, generally in the Spotlight Room of the Bone Student Center. Please feel free to encourage a qualified co-worker to accept this challenge, but please note that all nominees must sign the nomination form.

UPCOMING SOFTWARE WORKSHOPS



CIVIL SERVICE COUNCIL CONSTITUTION

Article VII - Committees

- A. There shall be standing committees and special committees as the need arises.
- B. The Chairperson of the Council shall appoint the chairpersons and members of the committees with the advice of the Council.
- C. Chairpersons shall be selected from among Council members.
- D. Committee members may be appointed from all Civil Service employees in a status position who have successfully completed their initial probationary period.
- E. Membership on standing committees shall be served during the Council year.
