

The Distinguished Service Award is the highest honor a staff member can receive at Illinois State.

The typical recipient demonstrates excellence in three areas:

- outstanding job performance
- campus-wide involvement
- community involvement

The award is based on significant contributions over a period of time and is not given for a single contribution. A person can receive the award only once every seven years.

Distinguished Service Award recipients receive a monetary award and a plaque. In addition, recipients' names are added to the University's Wall of Fame in the Bone Student Center.

Civil Service and Administrative/Professional Staff Distinguished Service Awards, and awards for outstanding faculty contributions, will be presented as part of the Founders Day Celebration in February, 2011. The campus community affirms the vital role each of us plays in our shared mission as a University as we join in recognizing exceptional performance.
