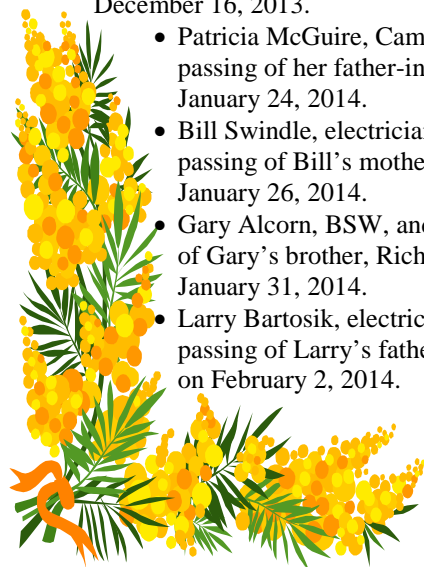

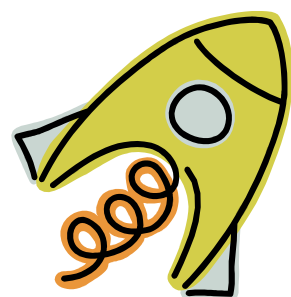
SECRET OF THE CARDBOARD ROCKET AT PLANETARIUM

NEW EXHIBITS AT MILNER LIBRARY

Living His Story, an exhibition comprised of photographs and recordings about World War II veterans across the Midwest, has opened at Milner Library. It features the work of School of Art senior Ashley Koenig and runs through May 4. The run was extended due to the overwhelming response the exhibit has generated. Each of the veterans Koenig has documented is accompanied by photographs of the veterans in active service. Exploring the relationship between war and memory, honor and tribute, this collection is presented as a series of portraits.

Also on display are World War II posters and samples of Newsmaps from Milner Library's Government Documents and map collections. The exhibition is sponsored by Milner Library and funded in part by Illinois State University Friends of the Arts.

Grimm Tales: An Artistic Perspective exhibit will run March 20 in Milner Library, sixth floor. The exhibit presents artworks influenced by the narratives and themes from the "Household Tales" by German folk story-tellers Jacob and Wilhelm Grimm. The contemporary works by faculty and students from the School of Art will be featured alongside illustrated editions of the Grimm tales from the library's Special Collections. The exhibit is sponsored by the School of Art's Art History Society (AHS), and Milner Library.



There will be a panel discussion and reception at 4 p.m. Feb. 26 on the sixth floor of the library. Panelists are Karen Coats and Jan Susina from the Department of English, Bill O'Donnell from the School of Art, and student Breanna White from AHS.
